

I arrived three days after the <u>Sky's the Limit exhibit</u> closed. Being in the museum sufficiently quelled my disappointment in missing this exhibit.









This day was spent with a friend — whom I've only known virtually for four years. We were both delighted that being in person affirmed our friendship. Lots of laughter and exploring.










Sights on my walks

It was great to experience the new exhibits. An afternoon at the museum with another friend followed by dinner at Del Frisco's.




Day 6: National Museum of the American Indian National Mall

The history of the indigenous peoples of this land is layered with both beauty and trauma, as evident by the exhibits.




